It is always a privilege to provide an update to the membership. I would like to share a brief summary of recent happenings at the Home. National Skilled Nursing week was recognized during a week-long celebration of our dedicated staff from all departments. Our HR Manager/Administrative Supervisor, Lori Patullo, along with Assistant Administrator, Shelretha LaSure and Activities Director, Simone Rudich orchestrated a spectacular week of festivities. Lori's efforts raised a significant amount of funds that covered all of the expenses including raffles, giveaways, food related events, activities, and entertainment.
