Message from Dr. Dawn Giakas New Jersey Eastern Star Home Administrator

Good afternoon. My name is Dr. Dawn Giakas and I am the Administrator at the New Jersey Eastern Star Home. It is my privilege to address this distinguished group today here at Grand Session.

July 1, 2020, was my first day as Administrator at the Eastern Star Home. I came to the NJESH with 30 years of experience in long term care. Even with all this experience, the past two years navigating a pandemic, the likes of which we have never seen was a bigger challenge than I had envisioned. It has

been extremely busy without any down time. I am not here to talk about our beautiful gardens or the décor of the Home. Rather, I will focus on operations, infrastructure, and the challenges faced by the long-term care industry, in general. This may not be a glamorous topic, but it is the true business of running a facility.

We have created a high-performing team of seasoned industry experts. From the DON to the Admissions Director, infection Control Coordinator and HR Manager, Business office Manager, the majority of the administrative team of Directors has been replaced and restructured, resulting in a cohesive group of individuals that work very well together as a team. This teamwork and cooperative spirit has been the foundation of our successes, both individual and collective. A systematic review of each area was conducted....I also examined the quality being provided by our rehab therapy provider and decided to hire another company. We have benefited with lower expenses and higher quality, resulting in better patient outcomes. For our subacute patients, which means successful and safe discharges back to the community and their own homes. I am continuing to review every contract for quality, service, and cost so that we can run as efficiently and safely as possible.

The Home is now a 5-star Facility due to 2 deficiency free inspections, one focusing on infection control and the other being the first ever, deficiency free annual survey enjoyed by the Home. For those of you not familiar with the 5-star rating, it is a designation awarded by CMS, the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services that rates facilities across the country. It helps consumers choose a quality facility for their loved ones. Closely related is the 5-star designation that we also received from US News and World Report, a trusted publication that I am sure most of you are familiar with. Our 5-star rating, low readmission rate, great therapy outcomes and los have landed us a spot as a Tier 1 preferred provider with the RWJ-Somerset hospital.



Our focus is driven by several core ideas/intentions: to provide the best quality of care to residents and to foster an environment of teamwork and professional growth and satisfaction. Both core goals have been achieved even during a pandemic.

July 2020, upon my arrival, the previous administration had voluntarily closed the facility to admissions. So, I was dealing with not only a clinical disaster, but a financial disaster. NO patients= no reimbursement or cash flow. There were only 39 patients in the building as many long-term residents had succumbed to COVID. I brought in a DON with the clinical expertise to manage the sit-

uation and keep our residents safe. In addition, I recruited a long-time infection control nurse with decades of experience, to administer our entire infection control program. I also hired a well-respected infectious disease specialist, which is now required by the NJ State DOH. We implemented strict covid testing procedures for both residents and staff. We adjusted our visitation protocols to comply with the DOH and Governor Murphy's guidance and closely communicated with families and residents to keep them informed of changing rules and requirements.

We learned to manage the pandemic, rather than be victimized by it. Our newly established team grew through the experience. We are still growing through it and adapting as the virus changes. However, what we did was re-established our community by re-opening and re-filling our beds. Our new Admissions Director hit the ground running and establishing ties in the local community. She has done an incredible job connecting with families and the hospital. It has been a steady process, first with consumers coming back to short term care after putting off surgeries as long as they could. Now, we are finding that consumers again are becoming more trusting of LTC again. We have helped this along by having a perfect annual survey and a spotless infection control survey and advertising that in the local papers, so that when Short or Long-Term-Care is needed, we want to be the first choice.

During the pandemic, the Home faced other challenges. On Jan 30, 2020, during the height of the pandemic, we had a pipe burst and extensive water damage that closed our subacute unit. We had to completely rebuild the unit. This was done in a record two-months, time under the direction of our Maintenance Director Peter Zoesch. We had to rehouse patients in other areas of the facility, a logistical nightmare during the pandemic. We united as a cohesive team and collectively managed the situation and built our unit back better than it originally was. Then came



2021 and our priorities once again shifted to another infrastructure issue....the 30-year-old boiler failed and we quickly had to put emergency equipment in place while the boiler was being replaced.

We are continuing to focus on short- and long-range plans to update our infrastructure. My predecessor did not focus on the need for a long-range capital plan, thus many large projects had to be completed in a brief period. And there are several more, large, capital projects that cannot be delayed, namely the replacement of the smoke detection system in the old portion of the f facility, the chiller replacement, and the replacement of the original 67-year-old boiler (which will be used as a backup) in the event of failures of the newly replaced boiler system.

This has been two years of rebuilding, reopening, and adapting to new challenges along the way. We have had to contend with running a LTC facility during a pandemic, staffing the building, admitting patients, and keeping our current patient safe and healthy from the virus. We also implemented an EMR this year which was a huge undertaking. This required doing business in a whole different w ay and training staff that were not computer literate. There was a huge learning curve, but we did it!

I can tell you that the year ahead will not be easy. Nursing Facilities are facing more cuts to reimbursement totaling \$320 million dollars for fiscal year 2023. This added to the fact we already lose about 40 dollars per patient per day on Medicaid residents. Washington DC has also taken a punitive approach on nursing homes, punishing all facilities, even those with excel-

lent quality of care, with more regulation and expense that will hurt our bottom line.

I felt it important to provide you with not only a picture of where we have been in the past two years, and all the obstacles we have overcome, but also a clear, vision of the industry and additional requirements that are being placed on Facilities that have been beaten down by the pandemic, rising expense costs and the cost of implementing new regulatory requirements.

Despite all of these factors, we will continue to work tirelessly for our long-term residents and short- term patients because it is our mission and our life's work. I appreciate the commitment of the Eastern Star members in supporting our Home in the many, ways you do, whether it is your time, your talents, your volunteer efforts or your donations, and hope that we can continue to count on your support in the year ahead.

I want to take a minute to pay special thanks to our Home Board. Debbie LeDoux, our outgoing board president, has been a steady beacon through the storm. She has been there for me since day one, always willing to listen to my concerns and make the best decisions for our Home and the residents. I have never seen such a dedicated Board President in all my years in healthcare. The Home Board members serve selflessly and give generously of their time and talents.

Thank you to the Home Board and thank you for the opportunity to address this group today.



Thanks, and praise. For our days. Neath the sun Neath the stars. Neath the sky As we go. This we know. God is nigh.

I too have felt the chills while listening to 'Taps' but I have never seen all the words to the song until now. I didn't even know there was more than one verse. I also never knew the story behind the song, and I don't know if you had either, so I thought I'd pass it along.
